## **Snapshot of Strengths**

#### **PSSA - ELA**

Increase in performance from previous year in ELA (62.0%) and meeting statewide goal range based on "all student groups"

#### **PSSA - Math**

Increase in performance from previous year in mathematics (51.1%) and exceeding interim target range based on "all student groups"

#### **PSSA - Science**

Increase in performance from previous year in science (78.7%) and meeting/exceeding interim target range based on "all student groups"

#### **PVAAS Math**

All student group (72%) which met/exceeds interim target, Students with disabilities (77%) also met/exceeds interim target



#### **PVAAS - ELA**

All student group (68.0%) which was an increase from previous year, Students with disabilities (58.3%) also an increase from previous year

# **Snapshot of Challenges - Subgroups**

# **Economically Disadvantaged**

In the PSSA advanced category, our economically disadvantaged students are under the statewide average in ELA, Math and Science ranging from 8% -12.8%.

### **Special Education**

In the subgroup "students with disabilities", the interim targets are met (77%), but not state goals in Math and Science.

Upgraded flow chart based on Strategies including professional development, student cohorts, family encouragement in learning, curriculum, regular teacher team meetings, and risk-review meetings (Corsella & Sharma, 2015).

#### Tutoring Campus Collaboration

Revisit when Covid-19 restrictions are lifted

#### Check In/Check Out

Connects to student cohorts created through team planning model
